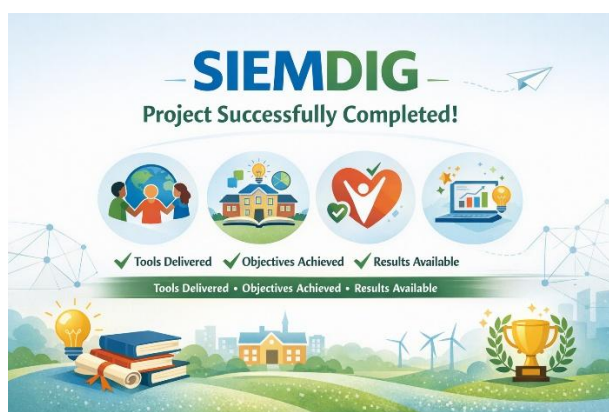

SIEMDIG Project Successfully Concluded – All Objectives Achieved



The **SIEMDIG** project has been successfully finalized. After an intensive period of international cooperation, research, piloting, and dissemination, the consortium confirms that **all planned objectives have been fully achieved**, and all foreseen results have been delivered.

The SIEMDIG project was designed to address one of the most pressing challenges in contemporary education: **how to support inclusive, equitable, and evidence-informed mathematics education for learners with diverse needs**, particularly those affected by socio-economic, cultural, emotional, and psychological barriers. Throughout the project’s lifecycle, partners worked collaboratively to translate research evidence into **practical, teacher-friendly tools** that can be applied directly in school practice.

Key Achievements

During the implementation period, SIEMDIG delivered a coherent and comprehensive set of results that together form a **practical inclusion ecosystem** for schools and educators:

- **Identification frameworks and indicators** supporting early recognition of socio-economic, cultural, emotional, and psychological disadvantages affecting learning.
- **Structured checklists and classroom tools** enabling teachers to reflect on classroom settings, teaching practices, material adaptation, and learner well-being.
- **Inclusive creativity and lesson planning resources**, supporting emotionally safe, culturally responsive, and engaging learning environments.
- **Ready-to-use activity sheets and lesson scenarios**, tested and refined through pilot implementations.
- **A publicly accessible project platform** gathering all outputs, press releases, and dissemination materials in one place.
